*** Remember – Jesus died for all, especially them that believe ...

Jesus came & conquered every major and minor disease ... Jesus conquered every sickness and infirmity ... Jesus conquered every oppression, depression, bondage, addiction or habit. Every single ailment known to mankind was defeated at the Cross, by the Blood of Jesus. Adam brought death, but Jesus brought life. The devil introduced sin & sickness, which causes bondage - misery, pain, unhappiness & death. But Jesus brought freedom from sin & sickness – He brought joy, peace, health, and a new life in Him on Earth & Heaven for those who accept Him.

OK Folks – Please try Jesus! Please don't get cheated by the devil, out of what God did for us through Jesus Christ. - Sin makes you perish ... sickness can make you perish. That's the devil's will and plan, not God's. God's plan through Jesus Christ is Life and that more abundantly."

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Isaiah 53: 1-12

- 1) "Who hath <u>believed</u> our <u>report</u>? And to whom is the Arm of the Lord revealed?
- <u>believed</u>: accepted as the truth
- <u>report</u>: spoken or written account of something that one has observed, heard, done, or investigated (1 John 1: 1-3)
- <u>revealed</u>: made (something) known to humans by divine or supernatural means; cause or allow (something) to be seen
 - 2) "For He shall grow up before Him as a tender plant, and as a root out of dry ground: He hath no form nor <u>comeliness</u>: and when we shall see Him, there is no beauty that we should desire Him."
- comeliness: quality of being good-looking or attractive
- <u>beauty</u>: a combination of qualities, such as shape, color, or form, that pleases the <u>aesthetic senses</u> (concerned with beauty), especially the sight
- desire: a strong feeling of wanting to have something or wishing for something to happen
 - 3) "He is <u>despised</u> and <u>rejected</u> of men; a man of <u>sorrows</u>, and <u>acquainted</u> with <u>grief</u>: and we hid as it were our faces from Him; he was <u>despised</u>, and we <u>esteemed</u> Him not."
- despised: regarded as worthless, hated, loathed, distasteful, seriously disliked or detested; looked down on with <u>contempt</u> (lack of respect or reverence) or <u>aversion</u> (avoid or turn away, ignore)
- <u>rejected</u>: not wanted, dismissed as inadequate, inappropriate, or unlikeable;
 refuse to accept, consider, submit to, hear, receive, or admit
- sorrows: feelings of deep distress/sadness/misery/depression caused by loss, disappointment, or other misfortune suffered by oneself or others - sickness
- <u>acquainted</u>: made (someone) aware of or familiar with something

- grief: reaction to a major loss; deep sorrow, pain, agony especially that caused by someone's death
- despised: regarded as worthless; hated, loathed, distasteful, seriously disliked or detested; looked down on with <u>contempt</u> (lack of respect or reverence) or <u>aversion</u> (avoid or turn away, ignore)
- <u>esteemed</u>: considered, deemed or regarded
 - 4) "Surely He hath <u>borne</u> our <u>griefs</u>, and <u>carried</u> our <u>sorrows</u>: yet we did <u>esteem</u> Him stricken, smitten of God, and afflicted."
- borne: carried or transported
- griefs: reactions to major losses; deep sorrows, pains, agony especially that caused by someone's death
- <u>carried</u>: supported and moved (someone or something) from one place to another
- <u>sorrows</u>: feelings of deep distress/sadness/misery/depression caused by loss, disappointment, or other misfortune suffered by oneself or others - sickness
- <u>esteem</u>: regard or deem (to hold in high regard or honor)
- stricken: affected by something overwhelming, such as disease, trouble, or painful emotion – our sins; incapacitated or disabled; the feeling of being hit or wounded as if by a missile
- smitten: struck by a heavy blow of a hand or weapon ... God's hand
- <u>afflicted</u>: suffering and pain caused by something or someone; trouble
 - 5) "But He was <u>wounded</u> for our <u>transgressions</u>, he was <u>bruised</u> for our <u>iniquities</u>: the <u>chastisement</u> of our <u>peace</u> was upon Him: and with His <u>stripes</u> we are healed."
- wounded: an injury to the body, especially one in which the skin or another
 external surface is torn, pierced, cut, punctured, or otherwise broken by
 external force
- <u>transgressions</u>: acts that go against laws (God's Laws), rules, or codes of conduct; (so whether we disobey God's teachings, or cheat on a test, on your taxes, or in a marriage, for example we are committing transgressions
- bruised: to injure the underlying soft tissue or bone of (part of the body) without breaking the skin; caused by a blow or strike to the skin's surface, breaking blood vessels, allowing a small amount of blood to leak into the tissues under the skin; the trapped blood under the skin appears as a black & blue mark
- <u>iniquities</u>: immoral or grossly unfair (wicked) behavior; sins & wickedness
- <u>chastisement</u>: to punish, as by beating; to inflict punishment on as by whipping; harsh scolding or rebuke
- peace: freedom from conflict, violence, disturbance and fear; quiet and tranquility; harmony with God-inwardly, only obtained of course through Jesus Christ
- stripes: beatings; striking with repeated blows so as to injure or damage

- <u>healed</u>: to make sound or whole again (we were once whole before Adam sinned); to restore to perfect health; to cause an undesirable condition to be overcome or ended
 - 6) "All we like sheep have gone <u>astray</u>; we have turned every one to his own way; and the Lord hath laid on Him the <u>iniquity</u> of us all."
- astray: away from the correct path, route, or direction; enter into error or morally questionable behavior
- <u>iniquity</u>: immoral or grossly unfair (wicked) behavior; sin & wickedness
 - 7) "He was <u>oppressed</u>, and He was <u>afflicted</u>, yet He opened not His mouth: He is brought as a lamb to the <u>slaughter</u>, and as a sheep before her shearers is <u>dumb</u>, so He openeth not His mouth."
- oppressed: subjected to harsh and authoritarian treatment (by the government of the Romans and the Jews); crushed and burdened by abuse of power or authority
- <u>afflicted</u>: suffering and pain caused by something or someone; trouble
- slaughter: where animals are killed for food or skins
- <u>dumb</u>: silent or quiet
 - 8) "He was taken from <u>prison</u> and from <u>judgment</u>: and who shall <u>declare</u> His <u>generation</u>? For He was cut off out of the land of the living: for the <u>transgression</u> of My people was He <u>stricken</u>."
- <u>prison</u>: a place (building or vessel) in which people are legally held as a punishment for crimes they have committed or while awaiting trial
- judgment: a misfortune or calamity viewed as a divine punishment
- <u>declare</u>: broadcast, proclaim, voice, or announce
- generation: a group of people born and living during the same time ... or the people in a family born and living during the same time; (whoever hears and receives the Gospel is part of His generation)
- <u>transgression</u>: an act that goes against a law (God's Laws), rule, or code of conduct
- stricken: affected by something overwhelming, such as disease, trouble, or painful emotion – our sins; incapacitated or disabled; the feeling of being hit or wounded as if by a missile
 - 9) "And He made His grave with the <u>wicked</u>, and with the <u>rich</u> in His death; because He had done no <u>violence</u>, neither was any <u>deceit</u> in His mouth."
- <u>wicked</u>: evil or morally wrong; sinful, bad, corrupt, mean, nasty, troublesome, irritating, vile, foul, disagreeable, hateful
- rich: having a great deal of money or assets; wealthy
- violence: behavior involving physical force intended to hurt, damage, or kill

- someone or something; strength of emotion or an unpleasant or destructive natural force
- <u>deceit</u>: the action or practice of deceiving someone by concealing or misrepresenting the truth; lying, double-dealing, fraud, trickery, guile
 - 10)"Yet it <u>pleased</u> the Lord to <u>bruise</u> Him; He hath put Him to <u>grief</u>: when thou shalt make an <u>offering</u> for sin, He shall see His seed, He shall <u>prolong</u> His days, and the <u>pleasure</u> of the Lord shall <u>prosper</u> in His hand."
- pleased: feeling or showing pleasure and satisfaction
- bruise: to injure the underlying soft tissue or bone of (part of the body)
 without breaking the skin; caused by a blow or strike to the skin's surface,
 breaking blood vessels, allowing a small amount of blood to leak into the
 tissues under the skin; the trapped blood under the skin appears as a black &
 blue mark
- <u>grief</u>: reaction to a major loss; deep sorrow, pain, agony especially that caused by someone's death
- offering: sin offering or sacrifice to satisfy a wrong or wrongs
- prolong: extend the length of something (Jesus is alive forevermore–Rev 1: 5-8)
- pleasure: delight; joy; feeling of happy satisfaction and enjoyment
- <u>prosper</u>: to cause to <u>succeed</u> (turn out well) or <u>thrive</u> (to grow vigorously; to gain wealth or possessions; to progress toward or realize a goal despite or because of circumstances); to become strong and flourishing ... (we have become more than conquerors through Jesus Christ-Romans 8: 37)
 - 11)"He shall see of the <u>travail</u> of His soul, and shall be <u>satisfied</u>: by His <u>knowledge</u> shall My <u>righteous servant justify</u> many; for He shall <u>bear</u> their <u>iniquities</u>."
- <u>travail</u>: work that is painful or labor intensive; great physical or mental exertion
- <u>satisfied</u>: contented or pleased
- knowledge: awareness or familiarity gained by experience of a fact or situation
- <u>righteous</u>: morally right, virtuous, very good, upright, justifiable, holy
- servant: slave; a person who performs duties for others; a person who is devoted to or guided by something ... (Jesus was devoted to God's Will-Hebrews 10: 7)
- <u>justify</u>: show or prove to be right ... (Jesus justified us by His Blood-Romans 5: 9)
- bear: carry or take on
- <u>iniquities</u>: immoral or grossly unfair (wicked) behaviors; sins & wickedness
 - 12)"Therefore will I <u>divide</u> Him a <u>portion</u> with the <u>great</u>, and He shall <u>divide</u> the <u>spoil</u> with the <u>strong</u>; because He hath <u>poured</u> out His soul unto death: and He was <u>numbered</u> with the transgressors; and He <u>bare</u> the sin of many, and made <u>intercession</u> for the <u>transgressors</u>."
- <u>divide</u>: split up or separate into parts

- <u>portion</u>: divide something into shares to be distributed among two or more
- great: above normal, distinguished, prominent, important, illustrious, famous, notable
- <u>divide</u>: split up or separate into parts
- <u>spoil</u>: goods of considerable or great value taken (or stolen) forcibly from a person or place (a plunder) ... (Jesus spoiled the principalities and powers of darkness through the Cross-<u>Colossians 2: 13-15</u>)
- strong: able to withstand great force or pressure; powerful; indestructible
- <u>poured</u>: flowed rapidly in a steady stream ... (Jesus didn't fight death, He laid down His life for us-<u>John 10: 16-17</u>)
- numbered: counted or grouped with (Mark 15: 28)
- bare: bore carried or took on
- <u>intercession</u>: the action of intervening on behalf of another, through prayer or physical action
- <u>transgressors</u>: people who violate laws or commands
